

Whether (Jesus) was born in 4 B.C. or A.D. 6, in Bethlehem or Nazareth, whether there were multitudes of the heavenly host to hymn the glory of it or just Mary and her husband — when the child was born, the whole course of human history was changed.

That is a truth as unassailable as any truth. Art, music, literature, Western culture itself ... it is impossible to conceive how differently things would have turned out if that birth had not happened...

This is the central truth that Matthew and Luke are trying to convey in their accounts of the Nativity. And it was a truth which no language or legend seemed too extravagant to convey.
