Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian; he led his flock beyond the wilderness, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the LIVING GOD appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed.
