The Acts of the Apostles

Acts 2:1-21 *(paraphrase)*

When the day of Pentecost, the feast of the Giving of the Law had arrived, the eleven disciples, the women and others who had also followed Jesus from the beginning were all together in the upper room where they had broken bread and shared the cup with him on the night of Passover before crucifixion and where he had met them on the night of the day he arose from the dead.

And suddenly, there was a sound from heaven like the rush of a mighty, driving wind filling all the house where they were sitting. And the light of God which shines in the darkness, which shines preeminently in the face of Jesus rested upon the head of each one of them, as if it were a flame, a tongue of fire, like that which burned in a bush on Sinai and consumed it not.

And they were, every one of them --- filled with the Holy Spirit.....the Spirit which brooded over the primeval chaos at Creation's Dawn....The Spirit which fell upon the prophets, enabling them to hear the word of the Lord, and to preach it...The Spirit which descended upon Jesus at his baptism...
