



The original Amistad (friendship in Spanish) was a coastal cargo vessel carrying 53 kidnapped Africans to be sold into slavery until they broke their chains and seized the ship. Thinking they were sailing for home and freedom, they were tricked by the pilot and apprehended off the coast of Long Island, N.Y. Brought to New Haven, Conn., they were jailed on charges of mutiny and murder.

The story might have ended there if it hadn't been for a courageous band of Congregational, Baptist and Presbyterian abolitionists who fought the charges all the way to the Supreme Court, which set the captives free on the grounds that they had never been slaves.

Out of that struggle, the abolitionists formed the American Missionary Association, which was eventually absorbed into the wider United Church of Christ.



Hebrew Lesson Isaiah 55:1-11 Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy? Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food. Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live. I will make with you an everlasting covenant...
