Jeremiah 23:23-32

## **UCC LEADERS CALL FOR ACTION TO END GUN VIOLENCE**

On the heels of two mass murders being committed in a little over 13 hours, United Church of Christ leaders issued a call to action, urging churches and people of faith to make gun violence prevention a prominent campaign issue, while offering prayers for victims, their families, and their communities. John Dorhauer, UCC General Minister and President, spoke out against white supremacist rhetoric, asking everyone to **take action** by urging your U.S. Senators to act immediately on pending gun violence legislation.
