James 2:1-10

My brothers and sisters, do you with your acts of favoritism really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ? For if a person with gold rings and in fine clothes comes into your assembly, and if a poor person in dirty clothes also comes in, and if you take notice of the one wearing the fine clothes and say, 'Have a seat here, please', while to the one who is poor you say, 'Stand there', or, 'Sit at my feet', have you not made distinctions among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts? Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? But you have dishonored the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court? Is it not they who blaspheme the excellent name that was invoked over you?

You do well if you really fulfill the royal law according to the scripture, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' But if you show partiality, you commit sin and are

convicted by the law as transgressors. For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it.

From there he set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. He said to her, 'Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs.' But she answered him, 'Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs.' Then he said to her, 'For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter.' So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone.

Then he returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is, 'Be opened.' And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, 'He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak.'

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT HOLY COVENANT

COMMUNION CHOREOGRAPHY

Because of COVID restrictions, our communion distribution is different from pre-COVID times. There is only one station for receiving communion - a table on the floor in front of the chancel steps. The bread is on the left side in individual paper cups. The juice is on the right, also in individual cups. Please follow the usher's directions. There is an elder on both sides of the table. Please pick up your own bread first and partake as the elder says, "The bread of life given for you." Then pick up your own juice as the second elder says, "The wine of the new covenant given for you." There is a trash can beside the table for the used cups. If you would prefer to receive communion at your seat, please let an usher know.

UPDATE FROM PASTORAL SEARCH TEAM

At the end of June, the Pastoral Search Team had identified three very strong candidates that we interviewed via Zoom twice. When we contacted them to pursue next steps, two had already accepted calls to other churches. We then brought the third candidate to Charlotte for a day of face-to-face interviews, informal discussion, and a sermon. The team unanimously agreed that that person was not the right fit for us. We have since reviewed 22 additional profiles, viewed online sermons, and scheduled Zoom interviews with two of the candidates, and possibly a third. We are meeting weekly now, and when necessary twice weekly. It is a slow process, and many are anxious, just as we are, but with renewed energy, commitment, and prayers, we will find the right pastor for Holy Covenant. We ask for your patience and prayers!
