Scripture Reading Genesis 2: 18-24 Mary Claiborne Then the Lord God said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner.' * Gospel Reading Mark 10: 2-16 Cheri Dennis Some Pharisees came, and to test him they asked, 'Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?' He answered them, 'What did Moses command you?' They said, 'Moses allowed a man to write a certificate of dismissal and to divorce her.' But Jesus said to them, 'Because of your hardness of heart he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation, "God made them male and female." "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." So, they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore, what God has joined together, let no one separate.'

NEIGHBORS IN NEED SPECIAL OFFERING

October 3, as part of World Communion Sunday, we will receive the Neighbors in Need special offering. Contributions may be made at any time throughout the month. This year, NIN's themed "Unfailing Love" offering is focused on supporting organizations and projects that are serving homeless and immigrant neighbors or communities. One-third of NIN funds support the <u>Council for American Indian Ministry</u> (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to provide funding grants to UCC churches and organizations leading justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects in their communities.

OCTOBER CHALLENGE FROM THE PASTOR

Theology. Even after five years in seminary, that's a word that I never quite grasp the meaning of. Simply put, it's the study of God or god. It's the study of the nature of the nature of the divine. Or maybe the study of faith. Then there's a particular religion's theology - that religion's specific beliefs about God or god. Then there's the theology that's a verb - sort of. The idea of "doing theology." (Well, for the English teachers, the verb in that sentence is "doing", not theology. . I guess I could use "theologizing.")

During the month of October, I'm inviting the entire congregation to "theologize" with me. I'm inviting you to "do theology" in community as we study together the Book of Proverbs. There are 31 days in the month of October

& 31 chapters in the book of Proverbs. I challenge each of us, including me, to read one chapter each day beginning Oct. 1st.

The overall goal of the Book of Proverbs is to "teach the acquisition of wisdom and the avoidance of folly." Wisdom and folly are explicitly mentioned all through Proverbs, but there are many more nuanced words used for similar ideas. What are they? What Proverbs still ring true? What Proverbs make no sense? The Sojourners Class (see below) will discuss Proverbs during our Sunday morning sessions in October. We will "do theology" in community. If you aren't able to join us on Sunday mornings, please contact me and share with me what you've learned about God, what questions do you have, what doesn't make sense, or what makes perfect sense but you don't agree. This is how we "do theology" in community. This is how we hear our still-speaking God. I hope you'll join me on this journey. Pastor Cheri
