Mother's Day Litany

Today is the day we celebrate mothers. For some Mother's Day is a day of delight and joyfulness. And for some, it's a day that is painful, complicated, and even layered. As we think about the vastly different connections and relationships there are to motherhood, we now take time to open our doors wide, making space for all experiences, as we hold in prayer this day:

Those who are proud and grateful for the mothers they have. Those who are holding good and tender memories of their mothers. Those who are grieving the loss of a mother on this day, who has since passed and is no longer with us.

All: God, for these we pray.

Those who are

healing from the abuse, violence, or neglect of a mother. Those who find their relationship with their mother to be complicated and difficult one. Those who have longed for maternal love but have found none.

All: God, for these we pray.

Those mothers who have lost children to suicide, disease, or estrangement. Those mothers whose children have gone missing or been abducted. Those mothers who are separated from their children due to family or marital conflict.

All: God, for these we pray.

Those mothers who have miscarried or had pregnancy end unexpectedly. Those who are now amid pregnancy and will soon be moms. Those who have desperately wanted or longed to be a mother to a child of their own but cannot.

All: God, for these we pray.

Those who have decided being a mother is not for them. Those who find the experience of motherhood to be challenging or difficult. Those mothers who are unhoused and caring for children with limited resources.

All: God, for these we pray.

Those who are mothers to foster children, stepchildren, or those not biologically their own. Those who delight in having not one mom but two or three or more. Those who found mothering in their teachers, neighbors, friends, relatives, and siblings.

All: God, for these we pray.

Those who mother businesses, non-profits, and movements. Those who are mothering furry friends, pets with whiskers, and animal companions. Those who mother and tend to the earth that in return nurtures and cares for us.

All: God, for these we pray.

God, we thank you for the gift of motherhood. For the many ways mothering looks, For the life that is given, for the care that is shown, and for the love of Godly mothering all we hope to know.

Our contemporary reading for today comes from Thomas Merton, who was a Trappist Monk, theologian, social activist, and writer. He says...

"It's a risky thing to pray and the danger is that our very prayers get between God and us. The great thing in prayer is not to pray, but to go directly to God...The fact is, though, that if you descend into the depths of your own spirit and arrive somewhere near the center of what you are, you are confronted with the inescapable truth that, at the very root of your existence, you are in constant and immediate contact with the infinite power of God."

* Gospel Reading John 17:1-19 (Adapted CEB) Pam Shimberg Our Gospel reading for today comes from John 17:1-9, where Jesus prays for his disciples...

When Jesus finished saying these things, he looked up to heaven and said, "Abba, the time has come. Glorify your Begotten One, so that the Begotten One can glorify you. You gave me authority over everyone so that I could give eternal life to everyone you gave me. This is eternal life: to know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you sent. I have glorified you on earth by finishing the work you gave me to do. Now, God, glorify me in your presence with the glory I shared with you before the world was created.

"I have revealed your name to the people you gave me from this world. They were yours and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you have given me comes from you. This is because I gave them the words that you gave me, and they received them. They truly understood that I came from you, and they believed that you sent me.

"I'm praying for them. I'm not praying for the world but for those you gave me, because they are yours. Everything that is mine is yours and everything that is yours is mine; I have been glorified in them. I'm no longer in the world, but they are in the world, even as I'm coming to you. Holy Abba God, watch over them in your name, the name you gave me, that they will be one just as we are one. When I was with them, I watched over them in your name, the name you gave to me, and I kept them safe. None of them were lost, except the one who was destined for destruction, so that scripture would be fulfilled. Now I'm coming to you and I say these things while I'm in the world so that they can share completely in my joy. I gave your word to them and the world hated them, because they don't belong to this world, just as I don't belong to this world. I'm not asking that you take them out of this world but that you keep them safe from the evil one. They don't belong to this world, just as I don't belong to this world. Make them holy in the truth; your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. I made myself holy on their behalf so that they also would be made holy in the truth.
