Modern Lesson the Words of Christopher McCandless

Our modern lesson for today is from the book "Into the Wild," which tells the true-life story of a young man, who hiked across America into the Alaskan Wilderness in the early 1990's. This reading is an adapted version of the letter Chris had written to his friend Ron during his journey...

"I'd like to repeat the advice that I gave you before, in that I think you really should make a radical change in your lifestyle and begin to boldly do things which you may previously never have thought of doing or been too hesitant to attempt. So many people live within unhappy circumstances and yet will not take the initiative to change their situation because they are conditioned to a life of security, conformity, and conservatism, all of which may appear to give one peace of mind, but in reality, nothing is more damaging to the adventurous spirit within a [person] than a secure future. The very basic core of [one's] living spirit is [their] passion for adventure. The joy of life comes from our encounters with new experiences, and hence there is no greater joy than to have an endlessly changing horizon, for each day to have a new and different sun. If you want to get more out of life...you must lose your inclination for monotonous security and adopt a helter-skelter style of life that will at first appear to you to be crazy. But once you become accustomed to such a life you will see its full meaning and its incredible beauty...Don't settle down and sit in one place. Move around, be nomadic, make each day a new horizon...it would be a shame if you did not take the opportunity to revolutionize your life and move into an entirely new realm of experience. You are wrong if you think joy emanates only or principally from human relationships. God has placed it all around us. It is in everything and anything we might experience. We just have to have the courage to turn against our habitual lifestyle and engage in unconventional living. My point is that you do not need me or anyone else around to bring this new kind of light in your life. It is simply waiting out there for you to grasp it, and all you have to do is reach for it. The only person you are fighting is yourself and your stubbornness to [turn] to new circumstances." - Christopher McCandless

Hebrew Lesson Isaiah 6:1-8 (CEB) Ed Vickery Our Hebrew lesson for today comes from Isaiah 6:1-8, where King Uzziah dies and Isaiah is called to the prophetic task of ministry...

In the year of King Uzziah's death, I saw the Lord sitting on a high and exalted throne, the edges of his robe filling the temple. Winged creatures were stationed around him. Each had six wings: with two they veiled their faces, with two their feet, and with two they flew about. They shouted to each other, saying:

"Holy, holy is the Lord of heavenly forces! All the earth is filled with God's glory!" The doorframe shook at the sound of their shouting, and the house was filled with smoke. I said, "Mourn for me; I'm ruined! I'm a man with unclean lips, and I live among a people with unclean lips. Yet I've seen the king, the Lord of heavenly forces!" Then one of the winged creatures flew to me, holding a glowing coal that he had taken from the altar with tongs. He touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips. Your guilt has departed, and your sin is removed."

Then I heard the Lord's voice saying, "Whom should I send, and who will go for us?" I said, "I'm here; send me."

HCUCC MAKES DONATION TO WORLD CENTRAL KITCHEN

In the wake of the immense humanitarian crisis Palestinians are facing in Gaza, the Mission & Justice Team at Holy Covenant UCC have decided to extend their work to international efforts and donate \$1000 to World Central Kitchen. World Central Kitchen's mission is to provide emergency food relief to people experiencing disasters and humanitarian crises across the world. 100% of donations to World Central Kitchen go to providing food, and currently they are providing aid in places such as Ukraine, Japan, Chile, Texas, and people being impacted by the Middle East conflict in areas such as Gaza, Egypt, and Lebanon. You also might recall that early last month, 7 World Central Kitchen workers lost their lives trying to deliver food in the Gaza strip. This donation also comes on the back of a delegation of UCC Members who delivered a ceasefire statement to congresspeople on Capitol Hill last week. We want to thank the Missions & Justice Team for their prayerful consideration in making this donation and all those who continue to support this ministry's important work.
