Modern Lesson

Our Modern Lesson for today comes Augustine, who was a bishop, theologian, philosopher, and saint of the early Christian Church. He is quoted as once having said...

Scripture Lesson

John 6:1-15 (CEB)

Our Scripture Lesson for today comes from the Gospel of John 6:1-15, where Jesus feeds the crowd that had gathered with five loaves and two fish...

After this Jesus went across the Galilee Sea (that is, the Tiberias Sea). A large crowd followed him, because they had seen the miraculous signs he had done among the sick. Jesus went up a mountain and sat there with his disciples. It was nearly time for Passover, the Jewish festival.

Jesus looked up and saw the large crowd coming toward him. He asked Philip, "Where will we buy food to feed these people?" Jesus said this to test him, for he already knew what he was going to do.

Philip replied, "More than a half year's salary worth of food wouldn't be enough for each person to have even a little bit."

One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, "A youth here has five barley loaves and two fish. But what good is that for a crowd like this?"

Jesus said, "Have the people sit down." There was plenty of grass there. They sat down, about five thousand of them. Then Jesus took the bread. When he had given thanks, he distributed it to those who were sitting there. He did the same with the fish, each getting as much as they wanted. When they had plenty to eat, he said to his disciples, "Gather up the leftover pieces, so that nothing will be wasted." So they gathered them and filled twelve baskets with the pieces of the five barley loaves that had been left over by those who had eaten.

When the people saw that he had done a miraculous sign, they said, "This is truly the prophet who is coming into the world." Jesus understood that they were about to come and force him to be their king, so he took refuge again, alone on a mountain.

RACIAL JUSTICE AND EQUITY TEAM INVITES YOU

The Racial Justice and Equity Team is discussing a number of important issues, including the need for affordable housing. We are looking for people with expertise or interest in this area. Mel Anderson attended the city's Faith &

Housing Summit on May 30 and provided an excellent overview of projects at several Charlotte churches. Several RJE members also have information and experience with these issues, and members of Holy Covenant's congregation have occasionally expressed interest in exploring whether we could use some of our land to meet the needs of the unhoused, the workforce or seniors. While Holy Covenant is not in the position now to launch a project of major scope, we could use a few interested people to learn more about the many available resources and opportunities and how they might fit with our mission of being a welcoming church that cares for all. SUMMER ALL-CHURCH READ: "OUR TRESPASSES"

All are invited to join Holy Covenant's All-Church Read this summer, which will culminate in an author visit Sept. 8.

"Our Trespasses: White Churches and the Taking of American Neighborhoods" tells the story of Charlotte's Brooklyn neighborhood through the North family, displaced by urban renewal, and the white congregation of the First Baptist Charlotte that purchased their land from the city. This local history examines how race, geography, policy and religion haunt landscapes in Charlotte, as they do in cities across the country. Understanding this history is a vital step in Holy Covenant's journey to creating a more just and equitable community. Author Greg Jarrell, an ordained minister, will preach at Holy Covenant during worship Sept. 8. Following worship and a break for light refreshments, Jarrell will discuss what he learned about the values and biases that are woven into Charlotte's development patterns.
