Our Scripture Lesson for today comes from the Gospel of John 6:35, 41-51, where Jesus tells those who are following him that he is "the bread of life".

Jesus replied, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

The Jewish opposition grumbled about him because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." They asked, "Isn't this Jesus, Joseph's son, whose mother and father we know? How can he now say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" Jesus responded, "Don't grumble among yourselves. No one can come to me unless they are drawn to me by the Father who sent me, and I will raise them up at the last day. It is written in the Prophets, and they will all be taught by God. Everyone who has listened to the Father and learned from him comes to me. No one has seen the Father except the one who is from God. He has seen the Father. I assure you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate manna in the wilderness and they died. SUMMER ALL-CHURCH READ: "OUR TRESPASSES"

All are invited to join Holy Covenant's All-Church Read this summer, which will culminate in an author visit Sept. 8. "Our Trespasses: White Churches and the Taking of American Neighborhoods" tells the story of Charlotte's Brooklyn neighborhood

through the North family, displaced by urban renewal, and the white congregation of the First Baptist Charlotte that purchased their land from the city. This local history examines how race, geography, policy and religion haunt landscapes in Charlotte, as they do in cities across the country. Understanding this history is a vital step in Holy Covenant's journey to creating a more just and equitable community. Author Greg Jarrell, an ordained minister, will preach at Holy Covenant during worship Sept. 8. Following worship and a break for light refreshments, Jarrell will discuss what he learned about the values and biases that are woven into Charlotte's development patterns. CHANGE TO ELECRONIC OFFERINGS

Beginning August 22, 2024, Subsplash, one of our online giving platforms, will change their default selection to charging the donor the processing fee assessed for each transaction. Right now, the donor can elect to cover the processing fee by clicking on the "cover fees" option in the payment box. Beginning August 22nd, the donor will need to elect to "not cover" the processing fee if desired and would need to make this change dashboard the Subsplash before completing their on transaction. While Subsplash offers a convenient way to make an electronic gift to the church, many banks offer free online banking to their customers, allowing them to send an electronic check to the church through their bill pay with no fees. We want to make sure all our Subsplash donors are aware of this upcoming change.
