Access and Disability Awareness Sunday is an annual celebration of the gifts persons with disabilities bring to the church, and the joys of being in accessible community. In the UCC, the second Sunday in October is designated as Access Sunday. As such, disability and accessibility are vitally important topics for us all, and for the church. This Access Sunday, let us honor and celebrate disability wisdom, creativity, and brilliance. Let us expand our notions of God and theology. And let us call one another into greater access for all.

Our Modern Lesson for today comes from Cole Arthur Riley, who is a writer and author centering Black emotions, histories, and bodies. In her debut novel "This Here Flesh" she says...

I've accepted that the whole of my life will be a pilgrimage toward the sound of the genuine in me. This may sound troubling to those who've been conditioned to believe that our journey is to God and God alone, but I say the two paths are one. My journey to the truth of God cannot be parsed from my journey to the truth of who I am. A fidelity to the true self is a fidelity to truth. I won't apologize

for this... And as a Black woman, I am disinterested in any call to spirituality that divorces my mind from my body, voice, or people.

*Gospel Lesson Mark 10:17-31 (NRSV) Pam Shimberg Our Scripture Lesson for today comes from Mark 10:17-31, where the rich young ruler comes to Jesus asking what he must do to inherit eternal life...

As he was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness. You shall not defraud. Honor your father and mother.'" He said to him, "Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, "You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." They were greatly astounded and said to one another, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible."

Peter began to say to him, "Look, we have left everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields for my sake and for the sake of the good news who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields, with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first."

STEWARDSHIP 2025

Each October, Holy Covenant develops a spending plan for the coming year that supports our many ministries. You can help the Budget and Finance Team in this work by letting us know what financial resources you intend to contribute to the church in 2025.

Our annual stewardship campaign's goal began Sept. 29 and runs through Oct. 20 this year. Our goal is to raise \$140,000 for the General Fund (operating fund) and \$40,000 for the Building Fund (capital fund). We will update the congregation each week on our progress. As of Friday, Oct. 11, pledges totaled \$65,450 for the General Fund and \$18,000 for the Building Fund.
