True community is built not on the erasure of difference, but on the celebration of it. Justice is not given, it is demanded, insisted upon, fought for with every breath. When we refuse to be silent in the face of oppression, we become part of a long and holy lineage of prophets who dared to speak truth to power. We do not stand alone; we stand with those who have come before and those who will come after. Our faith, if it is to mean anything at all, must be lived boldly in the streets, in our workplaces, in our relationships. This is the work of love. This is the work of God.

*Gospel Lesson Luke 13:31-35 (CEB) Lee Parrish Please take a comfortable posture that supports your reading and worshiping. Our Scripture Lesson for today comes the Gospel of Luke 13:13-35, where Jesus is warned by the Pharisees that Herod wants to kill him...

At that time, some Pharisees approached Jesus and said, "Go! Get away from here, because Herod wants to kill you."

Jesus said to them, "Go, tell that fox, 'Look, I'm throwing out demons and healing people today and tomorrow, and on the third day I will complete my work. However, it's necessary for me to travel today, tomorrow, and the next day because it's impossible for a prophet to be killed outside of Jerusalem.'

But you didn't want that. Look, your house is abandoned. I tell you, you won't see me until the time comes when you say, Blessings on the one who comes in the Lord's name."
