Joseph R. Renville's mother was Dakota and his father, French. An explorer, fur trader, and Congregational minister, Renville helped found the Lac qui Parle Mission in Minnesota in 1835. This song, which is also known as the "Dakota Hymn," was sung by thirty-eight Dakota prisoners of war as they were led to execution at Mankato, Minnesota, on December 26, 1862. This song was first published in the Dakota Indian Hymnal (1916).

Modern Lesson Tom Lannin Our Modern Lesson for today comes from Sherri L. Mitchell, who is an author and activist of the Penobscot (pronounced Puh-NAHB-skut) Tribe, an Indigenous people from the Northeastern Woodlands region of America. Among her work she says...

"We are taught that land and spirit are not separate, that everything is alive, that every being—rock, tree, river—is part of the web of life. When we live in relationship with that understanding, we begin to see that the craving for more—more land, more resources, more control—distorts our connections. We lose sight of reciprocity. Our fulfillment becomes a hunger, not a gift. If we can learn to give back, to honor what sustains us, to limit what we take, we reclaim peace. That peace is not passive—full of action, guided by responsibility. Fulfillment is not in having more, but in being more deeply in harmony with all that is."

One: May we hear what the Spirit is saying to the people.

Many: Open our ears, our hearts, our minds.

This Sunday, due to the length of the scripture reading, please remain seated.

Our Scripture reading for comes from 1 Timothy 6:6-19, where Paul reminds Timothy that true life is not found in wealth or possessions...

We will be sharing two translations- the first is from the First Nations Version in honor of Indigenous and Native Peoples of this country, which the UCC recognizes on this Sunday. Our second will come from the Common English Bible.

First Nations Version
An Indigenous Translation of the New Testament
Lee Parish

It is true that following the ways of the Great Spirit will lead to great possessions, but only when people are at peace with what they have. For we came into this world with nothing and can take nothing with us when we leave it. So, as long as we have food to eat and a roof over our heads, we should be at peace with what we have. Those who long for more and more possessions stumble into temptation and are trapped by many foolish desires that drag them down and take them to a bad end.

For the love of possessions is the root of many evil, thorny branches. Some, who have made possessions their aim in life, have walked away from the good road and have been pierced by thorns that bring them much pain and sorrow.

But you, O man who follows the Great Spirit, run away from these things and pursue doing what is right, living in a sacred way, trusting, loving, never giving up, and walking softly and in a humble manner. Fight for the good fight of trusting Creator. Get a firm hold on the life of the world to come that never fades away, full of beauty and harmony. The Great Spirit called you to this life when you said yes to him and made it known before many people that you had chosen to walk the good road with Creator Sets Free (Jesus) the Chosen One.

As you stand before the Great Spirit who gives life to all things, and before the Creator Sets Free (Jesus) the Chosen One, who told the truth in a good way when he stood before Spear of the Great Waters (Pilate), I call on you to follow through with this way of life to which he has called you. Keep walking a path that no one can find fault with until the day comes when our Honored Chief, Creator Sets Free (Jesus) the Chosen One, will appear. That day will be revealed when the time is right by the Blessed One who alone rules above all others, the Grand Chief Above All Chiefs. He is the only one over whom death have no power. His life shines so bright no one can even come near him, and no human eye has ever been able to fully see him. To him belongs all honor and power to the time beyond the end of all days. Aho! May it be so!

Instruct the ones who have many possessions in this present world not to see themselves as better than others. They must not put their hope in their many possessions, which cannot be depended on, but in the Great Spirit, who, from his great possessions, provides all we need to enjoy life. Instruct them to walk in a good way, to possess many good deeds, and to be willing and ready to share with those in need.

In this way, they will be storing up and preparing themselves for the life of the world to come, the true life of beauty and harmony that never grows old or fades away.

Common English Bible Kristin Andes

Actually, godliness is a great source of profit when it is combined with being happy with what you already have. We didn't bring anything into the world and so we can't take anything out of it: we'll be happy with food and clothing. But people who are trying to get rich fall into temptation. They are trapped by many stupid and harmful passions that plunge people into ruin and destruction. The love of money is the root of all kinds of evil. Some have wandered away from the faith and have impaled themselves with a lot of pain because they made money their goal.

But as for you, man of God, run away from all these things. Instead, pursue living, faithfulness, righteousness, holy love, endurance. gentleness. Compete in the good fight of faith. Grab hold of eternal life-you were called to it, and you made a good confession of it in the presence of many witnesses. I command you in the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and Christ Jesus, who made the good confession when testifying before Pontius Pilate. Obey this order without fault or failure until the appearance of our Lord Jesus Christ. The timing of this appearance is revealed by God alone, who is the blessed and only master, the King of kings and Lord of lords. He alone has immortality and lives in light that no one can come near. No human being has ever seen or is able to see him. Honor and eternal power belong to him. Amen.

Tell people who are rich at this time not to become egotistical and not to place their hope on their finances, which are uncertain. Instead, they need to hope in God, who richly provides everything for our enjoyment. Tell them to do good, to be rich in the good things they do, to be generous, and to share with others. When they do these things, they will save a treasure for themselves that is a good foundation for the future. That way they can take hold of what is truly life.
