Modern Lesson Jason Sullivan

Our Modern Lesson for today comes from Samuel Rayan, who was a pioneer of Asian liberation theologian and Jesuit Priest long engaged in issues of injustice and inequality for the poor. Today's lesson is adapted from his writings on hope, Christian community, and faith. He says...

"We are called to live faith in the daily life of people, especially in the lives of the most marginalized and oppressed. Faith is not an ideal of grandeur but a practice of presence—break bread, share breath, care for the earth. When our faith is 'thin,' when we doubt or struggle, those are not disqualifications but openings. In those cracks the Spirit whispers louder. Trusting becomes enough. Love becomes the proof that God is already at work."

So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, 'We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!' "
