Our Modern Lesson for today comes from bell hooks, who was an educator, writer, and social activist known for her work on challenging racism and gender. Among her writings she says...

"Those who came before us dreamed us into being. They worked, loved, resisted, and hoped so that we might live more freely. When we name them and remember them, we remember that we are part of a great continuum of love. Their lives were not perfect, but they were faithful to the possibility of transformation. Every act of care, every word of truth, every gesture of defiance has brought us here. Our remembering becomes a form of resistance—it keeps their love alive in the world. Let us carry forward what they gave us and make of our lives an offering to those yet to come."

Scripture Lesson Revelation 7:9-17(NIV) Eric Miner Our Scripture Lesson for today comes from the book of Revelation 7:9-17 (NIV), where John of Patmos shares his vision of a great multitude that will celebrate the victory of God's kin-dom...

After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb."

All the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They fell down on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, saying: "Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honor and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!"

Then one of the elders asked me, "These in white robes—who are they, and where did they come from?" I answered, "Sir, you know." And he said, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. Therefore, "they are before the throne of God and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence. 'Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst. The sun will not beat down on them,' nor any scorching heat. For the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd; 'he will lead them to springs of living water.' 'And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.'"

Invitation to the Table

- P1: Today, we gather in the spirit of All Saints Day, remembering those who have come before us: our ancestors in faith who shaped communities with their love, courage, and commitment to justice. We honor their legacy as we come together at this table, united in our diversity.
- Many: We remember the saints who taught us to love one another, even in our differences. We celebrate their witness, as we seek to embody their spirit today.
- P2: As we prepare our hearts for communion, let us acknowledge that we are not always of one mind. We may hold different political perspectives and disagree on various issues, yet we are called to be in community with one another. Here, at this table, we are reminded that our unity is found not in uniformity, but in our shared commitment to love and support one another.

- Many: In this sacred space, we affirm that our differences enrich our community. We are called to listen, to learn, and to grow together, even when we struggle to understand one another.
- P2: In the breaking of bread and sharing of cup, we are reminded of Christ's radical love. A love that welcomed all, broke down barriers, and transformed lives. A love that invites us to lay aside our judgments and embrace one another as beloved children of God.
- Many: We come to this table with open hearts, ready to receive and to give grace. We are reminded that the body of Christ is diverse and beautiful, made up of all our stories, struggles, and triumphs.

Words of Institution

- P1: On the night He was betrayed, Jesus gathered with His friends. He took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Let this be a sign that God will always love you.
- Many: We remember the sacrifice of love that calls us to act justly, to love with mercy, and to walk humbly together.
- P2: In the same way, after supper, He took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, do so in remembrance of me." Let this be a sign that God will always be with you.
- Many: We are grateful for this covenant, which binds us together in love and grace, inviting us to see the Christ within one another.
- P1: All things are ready, let us know share together in Christ' meal.
