“Hope is not the soft thing we’ve mistaken it for; it is the steady decision to rise again when the world has given us every reason to fold. It is the quiet voice inside that whispers, ‘There is another way,’ even when we cannot yet see it. Hope teaches us to trust that God is already moving, already stirring, already healing things we do not have the strength to name. It refuses to let cynicism have the last word. And when we practice hope together, we become a community that lifts one another into possibility. Hope, in the end, is the courage to believe that God’s future is still worth walking toward.”
