

Advent Candle 4: Love

Today, we light the fourth candle of Advent, the candle of Love.

[Light the candle]

We light this candle to remind us that God’s love is the source of all things. Love is the power which causes us to offer forgiveness, to embrace the forgotten, to liberate the oppressed, to see each other as sacred and whole.

This love is not simply sentimental feelings, it is also a force that can be fierce, healing, and liberating. As this candle burns, we remember that to love as Christ did is at times the willingness to risk ourselves for the sake of others. We light this candle trusting that it is God’s love which endures.
