Jeremiah 31: 7-14 (CEB)

Our Scripture reading for today comes from Jeremiah 31:7-14, where the prophet shares with the Israelites what it will be like when they return home to Jerusalem...

The Lord proclaims: Sing joyfully for the people of Jacob; shout for the leading nation. Raise your voices with praise and call out: “The Lord has saved his people, the remaining few in Israel!” I’m going to bring them back from the north; I will gather them from the ends of the earth. Among them will be the blind and the disabled, expectant mothers and those in labor; a great throng will return here. With tears of joy they will come; while they pray, I will bring them back. I will lead them by quiet streams and on smooth paths so they don’t stumble. I will be Israel’s father, Ephraim will be my oldest child. Listen to the Lord’s word, you nations, and announce it to the distant islands: The one who scattered Israel will gather them and keep them safe, as a shepherd his flock. The Lord will rescue the people of Jacob and deliver them from the power of those stronger than they are. They will come shouting for joy on the hills of Zion, jubilant over the Lord’s gifts: grain, wine, oil, flocks, and herds. Their lives will be like a lush garden; they will grieve no more. Then the young women will dance for joy; the young and old men will join in. I will turn their mourning into laughter and their sadness into joy; I will comfort them. I will lavish the priests with abundance and shower my people with my gifts, declares the Lord.

The Invitation

Rev. Christopher Czarnecki

One: God be with you.

Many: And also with you.

One: Lift up your hearts.

Many: We lift them up to God.

One: Let us give thanks to the Holy One.

Many: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Pastor: As we cross the threshold of a new year, we come to a table where God meets us exactly where we are. This is the table of the Christ child, just born and growing, who understood what it means to journey through life with all its questions and longings, its blessings and challenges, who knew both the joy of coming home to God and the ache of feeling far from it. The table Jesus set was a table for everybody and every soul. For people of all genders and no gender, for every sexuality and expression of love, for every race and ethnicity, for the documented and undocumented, for those with resources and those without, for those with faith and those with

questions. No matter what you carried into this new year, or what you wish to leave behind or hold onto, there is a place for you here.

Many: We gather at this table as we are, and here we are welcome.

Prayer of Remembrance

Pastor: God of new beginnings, we come just bearing the gift of Jesus, whose birth we still celebrate in these days after Christmas. In sending Jesus to us, you showed us that the ordinary is sacred, that the divine dwells within us, and the heavens can touch the earth and make it its home. Soon Jesus will come announcing that the kin-dom of God was breaking in, not far away, but here and now. In breaking bread, he ate with tax collectors and sinners, with women and children, with the sick and the outcast. He showed us that in God's kin-dom all are fed, valued, and belong. As we taste this bread and cup, may we remember that you love us. You love us into wholeness, you meet us in our mess, and you are the presence that calls us forward into new life.

Many: We remember God's love and claim it as our own.

Words of Institution

On the night he was betrayed, Jesus gathered for a last meal among friends. And at that table as they ate, he took bread, gave thanks for it, blessed it and broke it, and said: "*This is my body, given for you. Whenever you eat it, remember me.*"

Let this be a sign that God will always love you.

In the same way after supper, Jesus took the cup. And after giving thanks he blessed it, poured it, and gave it to his disciples and said: "*This cup is the new covenant, poured out in love for all people. Whenever you drink it, remember me.*"

Let this be a sign that God will always be with you.

Sharing of the Elements

Send us out to live as people who know we belong to you and to each other. Make us instruments of your peace, give us the courage to speak truth to power, and to work for justice even when it is hard. May we remember that every day is a chance to begin again, and that you are always inviting us home to the awareness of your love. Amen.
