Modern Lesson

Alice Phelan-Young

Our Modern Lesson for today comes from Rachel Held Evans who was influential writer known for her thought-provoking critiques of evangelical culture and her advocacy for a more inclusive, questioning, justice-oriented Christianity. In her book “Searching for Sunday” she says...

Baptism reminds us that there's no ladder to holiness to climb, no self-improvement plan to follow. It's just death and resurrection, over and over again, day after day, as God reaches down into our deepest graves and with the same power that raised Jesus from the dead wrests us from our pride, our apathy, our fear, our prejudice, our anger, our hurt, and our despair. We all long for someone to tell us who we are. The great struggle of the Christian life is to take God's name for us, to believe we are beloved and to believe that is enough...Baptism declares that God is in the business of bringing dead things back to life, so if you want in on God's business, you better prepare to follow God to all the rock-bottom, scorched-earth, dead-on-arrival corners of this world—including those of your own heart—because that's where God works, [and] that's where God gardens.

One: May we hear what the Spirit is saying to the people.

Many: Open our ears, our hearts, our minds.

Matthew 3:13-17 (NRSV)

Please take a comfortable posture that supports your reading and worshiping... Our Scripture reading for today comes from Mathew 3:13-17, where Jesus comes to the Jordan River to be baptized by John the Baptist...

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, “I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?” But Jesus answered him, “Let it be so now, for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness.” Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw God’s Spirit descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from the heavens said, “This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.”
